Here are some of my classes, and the techniques students will learn. All classes typically take 6 hours, (except The Beaded Doll: A Primer).

Bead Embroidery: Boot Camp



The principals of design and color theory, how to transfer and paint designs, multiple bead embroidery stitches, Gold Work embroidery and finishing techniques.

Beaded Bowl: A Primer



Students will have homework before class to create the 4 panels for the bowl. Complete instructions with a paper template will be sent before class. Assembly and embellishments will be done in class.

Beaded Button: An Element in Design



An exploration of color, texture and design. Each button is worked in a peyote stitch around a center design element.

The Beaded Doll: A Primer



How to build a free standing armature, shape and cover body with material ready for beading. Designing doll's clothing using a variety of bead stitches and beads. This class requires 2 days.

Flowers For Pondo



My variation of the Pondo Stitch to create a collar necklace base. Flowers will be cut and shaped from heat treated brass, or alcohol ink, and finished with a hammered texture.

Funky Doll



The Tubular Peyote stitch is used to create a miniature doll that can be used as a pin, pendant or free standing doll. Designing and embellishing the costume to fit the doll's personality.

Pumpkin Box: A Beaded Vessel



How to increase and decrease in and even count peyote stitch by using different size beads. Embellishments will be added to create a design.



Ellen R Solomons studied at the University of Georgia, the University of Connecticut and the Massachusetts College of Art.
